



Jasper Bonafed, the bicycle dealer, sponsored a bicycle race. John Kuzma won the gold medal. George Tablak won a watch; Frank Arrigo, a stickpin and cuff link set; Mike Janotta, a gold knife and chain ; Pete Cherocci, silver medal; Bernard Samuels, bronze medal; Kenneth Geiselhart, bike tire; William Sanchey, pair of skates; Lindsey Tinegly, tool bag and James Bonafed, bicycle siren. (07-05-1923) Daily Independent

The twenty-fourth annual banquet of the German Beneficial Union will be held July 15, 1923 in the hall at Second and Donner Avenue and feature the burning of the mortgage. (07-06-1923) Daily Independent

The Star Theatre on Sixth Street has been remodeled at a cost of \$5000 with a new steam heating plant installed by Monessen Plumbing Company. The basement was excavated an additional four feet deeper. New dressing rooms were installed and a new Minens Gold Film Screen set in place. (07-07-1923) Daily Independent

Employees of the National Works of the American Sheet and Tin Plate Company will get a 10% increase in wages. (07-09-1923) Daily Independent

Concetta Lamaro, age 14, was committed to the Home of the Good Shephard in Pittsburgh. Her parents charged her with incorrigibility. (07-13-1923) Monessen News

Monessen School Board hired Charles Hossmaster as the industrial arts machine shop teacher. Miss Kathryn Denniston was also hired as the cooking teacher. (07-13-1923) Monessen News

Sixty citizens will meet Thursday in Johnson's Banquet Room to determine a style and location for the soldiers' memorial in Monessen. (07-17-1923) Monessen News

A family quarrel broke out on East Schoonmaker Avenue several days ago. Yesterday, Mrs. Sepetsky had Mrs. Annie Lenhart arrested. Several hours later after a hearing, the two women met again. Mrs. Sepetsky choked Mrs. Lenhart, at which time, Mrs. Lenhart used a can on the back of Mrs. Sepetsky's head. The Police were called and both were arrested. Each was found guilty by Mayor Woodward and fined \$2.00 and costs. (07-17-1923) Daily Independent

Tonight's newspapers report that Carlotta, the former Empress of Mexico and widow of Emperor Maximillian von Hapsburg, is dying at her castle in Belgium. She reigned from 1864-1867. (Her Majesty did not die until 1927) (07-18-1923) Daily Independent

The new Seagrave fire truck with attached pump will arrive next week. The firemen will parade down Donner and Schoonmaker with the new truck. The Firemen's Band will give a concert at the Freight Station. (07-20-1923) Monessen News

Harry Lebowitz's pool hall, Harry's Place" drew 5000 people to its opening last night. (07-20-1923) Daily Independent

For the new memorial, a statue of Victory was chosen. Jones Brothers, of Boston, submitted a price of \$5,200, which includes placement. The recommendation is to erect it on the grounds of the High School. (07-20-1923) Monessen News

Monessen City Council has received a petition to recognize Parkway as a residential street of sixteen feet from Fourth to Sixth. (07-20-1923) Monessen News

Monessen's Silver Anniversary celebration will be held on September 4, 1923 with an informal dedication of the new Junior High School. (07-27-1923) Monessen News July Weddings, Divorces and Engagements of 1923

Professor W. F. Blackburn, Principal of the new Monessen Junior High School, wed Miss Nettie Barkman, a teacher. (07-10-1923) Monessen News

Miss Grace Falk, the bookkeeper for Wright Furniture Store, and John Stevenson, of Knox Avenue, married on June 15, 1923. (07-13-1923) Monessen News

Miss Leona Anderson, McKee Avenue, and Harrison Irwin, North Carolina, wed on Saturday. The bride is an employee of the Monessen Daily Independent, but will resign on September 13, 1923. (07-17-1923) Monessen News

The wedding of Miss Amelia R. Patrick, Monessen, and Joseph J. Graham, Uniontown, was held on Wednesday at St. Leonard's Roman Catholic Church. The bride is employed as a stenographer for the Pittsburgh Steel Company. (07-27-1923) Monessen News

Zealand L. Carter, Monessen, to divorce Nora Jane Carter. They wed on December 5, 1922. Adultery is the charge. (07-31-1923) Monessen News

Samuel C. Meckley, Monessen, and Mrs. H. Jennie Kemerer, Manor, wed on July 28, 1923. The groom works as a painter and paper hanger for Herbert Shambaugh. (07-31-1923) Daily Independent

Eastside Land Company Closes Its Doors

February 24, 1923 marked the closing of Monessen's first Real Estate Office, the East Side Land Company. The Real Estate Department of the Monessen Trust Company will take charge of the company's business dealings. H. Dallas McCabe, the secretary and manager of the East Side Land Company will relocate to 331 Fourth Street, where he will operate as a civil engineer.

The East Side Land Company was incorporated on August 21, 1894, after which it acquired the farm land on which Monessen now stands. It comprised 525 acres.

The leading stockholders of the enterprise were Colonel James M. Schoonmaker, Hon. Philander C. Knox, who later became Attorney General in the McKinley Administration and Secretary of State under William Howard Taft, Judge James H. Reed, George O. Morgan, H. Sellers McKee and George B. Motheral. The main streets of Monessen bear their names.

The opening sale day, July 27, 1897, was possible by the building and opening of the National Tin Plate Works, known as the American Sheet and Tin Plate Company. At that time, William Henry Donner, now president of the East Side Land Company and president of the Donner Steel Company, Inc. of Buffalo, NY, acquired an interest in the company.

M. J. Alexander was manager of the company from 1897-1899, after which

Sidney L. Lorenz took over until 1900. Mr. McCabe was then appointed to the office. Sales of property under his guidance totaled \$1,500,000.

A Recipe For You

From the table of Mrs. James M. Schoonmaker II.

Chicken breast with garlic and rosemary

8 cloves garlic

2 T. sugar

1/3 C. butter

1/2 C. dry vermouth

1/2 C. chicken stock

6 sprigs fresh rosemary

1/2 C. heavy cream

4 boneless skinless chicken breasts

In a saucepan, place garlic, sugar, ¼ C. butter and vermouth. Heat and reduce until garlic caramelizes, add chicken stock and 2 sprigs rosemary.

Simmer until reduced by half, add cream and let sauce thicken. Swirl in rest of butter. Grill chicken breasts, spoon sauce over each and garnish with rosemary.

Remove from oven and sprinkle with grated cheese. Cut and serve hot or cold.
